On 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2017 NSS unit was started with 100 volunteers in Govt. College for Women Pali, Rewari. Two types of activities are conducted in NSS- Regular activities (120 hours) and Annual Special Camp (120 hours). All the volunteers have to serve in NSS for at least 2 years for 240 hours to get certification from the university under the signature of Vice Chancellor and programme coordinator.

- ❖Three dailies- The Hindu, Amar Ujala and Dainik Bhaskar are subscribed in the library to acquire day to day knowledge and current update for students and teachers.
- ❖the library has been strengthened this year by adding 240 books with

automation of books.

- ❖Wi-fi connection has been installed in library. The library has been made air condition with installation of four tower AC in the library.
- ♦One vacuum cleaner has been provisioned in the library for keeping the books and bookrakes dust free.
- ❖02 monthly Magazines- Pratiyogita Darpan and Samanya Gyan Daepan have been subscribed in the library for the students to enhance their knowledge.
- ❖02 Journals, the Journal of Haryana Studies and the Kurukshetra International Research Journal have been subscribed in the library to inculcate research orientation in students and teachers.
